Special Events and Projects Opening of new Children's Discovery Garden Water Feature

The Children's Discovery Garden made a splash - literally - this spring with the opening of a revamped water feature! Similar to a splash pad, the new fresh water system will gurgle, bubble, spray, or pop depending on the rocks. It will require less maintenance allowing MetroParks staff to focus on other areas of the park. It also has an auto shut off feature to encourage kids to explore other areas of the gardens while the system resets. The entirety of the \$164,000 project was proudly funded by the Wegerzyn Gardens Foundation.





